

Our democracy, Parliament, Parliamentary systems and procedures and the participation of people's representatives have played a crucial role in furthering the nation's glorious journey.



# Introduction: A Vision for Communication Excellence



## The Dawn of a New Era in Indian Economy

In 1991, under Prime Minister P.V. Narasimha Rao's leadership, India embarked on a transformative journey with the liberalization of its economy. The historic decision to dismantle the 'License Raj' marked a paradigm shift from decades of controlled economic policies to an open market system. While this bold move faced initial criticism and resistance, it unleashed unprecedented opportunities and challenges for both public and private sector organizations.

# **Recognizing the Communication Gap**

As India's economy opened its doors to global competition, a critical need emerged: organizations needed to transform their communication strategies to thrive in this new environment. K. Srinivasan, then serving as a Corporate Communication Manager at a Public Sector Bank's Delhi Regional Office, witnessed this transformation firsthand. His role as the bank's liaison officer to the Government of India and Parliament provided unique insights into the communication challenges facing public sector organizations.

#### **Pioneering Public Sector Communication**

Upon his transfer to Chennai, Srinivasan embarked on a



transformative initiative that would help reshape public sector communication. With strategic guidance from S. Narendra, the Information Advisor to the Prime Minister, he established the 'Public Sector PR Forum' (PSPRF) in 1994. This groundbreaking forum unified all Union Government public sector organizations operating in Tamil Nadu under a single banner of communication excellence.

The Forum's leadership team brought together distinguished professionals: Srinivasan as General Secretary, Ansar Shah of Chennai Petroleum Corporation Ltd. as President, and Hariprasad of Chennai Port Trust


as Vice President. With robust support from the Press Information Bureau, PSPRF quickly emerged as a catalyst for change in public sector communication.

In its mission to prepare organizations for the liberalized economy, the Forum orchestrated numerous high-impact seminars and workshops. These sessions, attended by top management officials, focused on equipping public sector organizations with modern communication strategies and tools for the competitive landscape ahead.

A historic milestone in the Forum's journey came on August 15, 1995, when it participated in a transformative moment in India's digital history. Videsh Sanchar Nigam Limited (VSNL), the state telecommunications company, chose to launch internet services in Chennai in the presence of PSPRF members—a testament to the Forum's growing influence. Recognizing the internet's potential to revolutionize organizational communication, VSNL and PSPRF joined forces to conduct pioneering workshops. These sessions introduced public sector organizations to the power of internet communication, helping them navigate the dawn of India's digital age.

This strategic positioning at the intersection of traditional and digital communication demonstrated the Forum's foresight in preparing public sector organizations for the future. Through these initiatives, PSPRF played a crucial role in modernizing public sector communication strategies and facilitating their transition into the digital era.

# **A Divine Inspiration**



1998 marked a pivotal moment when Srinivasan contemplated leaving his banking career to establish a communication consultancy. In an era when leaving a secure public sector position was almost unthinkable, he sought the blessings of Sri Jayendra Saraswathi Swamigal, the Kanchi Sankaracharya.

During their momentous meeting, the Sankaracharya offered a profound insight that would prove prescient. "You are popular as [Bank Name] Srinivasan and wield financial powers. If you quit, you will stand alone," he observed. Srinivasan's immediate response reflected both his vision and unwavering determination: "With

your blessings, I will create an institution myself that can involve others too."

The Sankaracharya's subsequent blessing and inauguration of the communication consultancy in 1998 set the stage for a transformative mission. His words proved prophetic: today, the man once known solely by his banking identity has earned a new recognition as "Prime Point Srinivasan" – a name that reflects both his institutional legacy and his mission. The name "PRIME POINT" itself was thoughtfully suggested by S. Narendra, adding another meaningful layer to this journey of transformation.

This divine blessing and guidance marked not just a career transition, but the beginning of an institutional legacy that would touch countless lives through communication excellence.

## Foundation of a Legacy: A Pioneering Vision



December 20, 1999 marked a watershed moment in India's communication landscape. On this historic day, Prime Point Foundation emerged as a pioneering institution when the country navigated the dual waves of economic liberalization and digital revolution. Founded by K. Srinivasan with the steadfast support of S. Narendra, the Foundation's launch at Hotel Palmgrove, Chennai, brought together visionaries who foresaw the crucial role of strategic communication in India's transforming economy.

The inauguration ceremony itself reflected the Foundation's aspirational reach. Two distinguished luminaries graced the occasion: Dr M.S. Swaminathan,

the renowned agricultural scientist and architect of India's Green Revolution, and T.S. Raghavan, the Chairman of the Indian Bank.



Their presence underscored the Foundation's commitment to bridging the worlds of scientific advancement, economic growth, and effective communication. The carefully chosen group of inviteees represented a cross-section of thought leaders who would become instrumental in shaping the Foundation's future trajectory.



Formally registered as a non-profit public trust on July 5, 2000, with due recognition from the Income Tax department, the Foundation embarked on its unique mission. In an era when India was still adapting to the sweeping changes brought about by economic liberalisation (1991) and the advent of the internet (1995), Prime Point Foundation emerged as the first organization dedicated to fostering communication excellence. Its mission threefold: was creating communication awareness across organizations, developing leadership skills, and nurturing quality journalism—three pillars that would prove crucial in the years ahead.

The Foundation's timing and focus captured significant media attention, with widespread coverage highlighting its innovative approach. As the first organization of its kind to recognize and address the critical need for strategic communication in post-liberalization India, it quickly gained support from both public and private sector organizations. This unprecedented initiative filled a crucial gap in India's professional landscape, offering a platform where communication excellence could be cultivated, celebrated, and championed.

The enthusiastic response from diverse sectors validated the founders' vision: India needed an institution dedicated to elevating communication standards in an increasingly complex and connected world. This watershed moment would prove to be just the beginning of a remarkable journey that would influence countless organizations and professionals in the decades to come.

#### **A Quarter Century of Impact**

As the Foundation celebrates its 25th year, it stands proud with five dynamic initiatives: the eMagazine PreSense, Education Loan Task Force, Sansad Ratna

Awards, Digital Journalists Association of India, and Next Gen Political Leaders. Each initiative represents a testament to professional excellence, managed by distinguished volunteers driven by a commitment to social impact rather than

commercial gain. This remarkable journey from a seed of inspiration to a flourishing foundation demonstrates the power of vision, determination, and collaborative effort in creating lasting institutional change.



# Prime Point Foundation and its Initiatives: An Overview

**Prime Point Foundation**, a Non-Profit Trust and NGO, was founded in December 1999 by Shri K Srinivasan (popularly known as Prime Point Srinivasan), a former Senior Banker, digital Journalist, and Communication Professional, to promote leadership and communication skills among the youth. The foundation is associated with many eminent persons.

In the past 25 years, the Foundation has organised several seminars, workshops, training and interactive sessions, both offline and online, on various subjects of national interest. The Foundation manages various online discussion groups and podcasts on communication, and digital journalism.

The Foundation has formed 5 initiatives to create awareness in various domains. All these initiatives are managed independently by passionate experts. They are non-commercial and focussed on youth.

Presense: The eMagazine Presense was started in March 2006 on the suggestion of Dr APJ Abdul Kalam to promote positive journalism. Till July 2024, the Foundation has published 209 editions. This is a digital-only magazine. Digests containing select articles, up to 150 editions of the eMagazine, have so far been published. Dr Abdul Kalam has written the foreword for the Digest of articles up to 100 editions. Presense publishes the cartoon character Prince, which was launched by Dr Abdul Kalam in 2008. Presense has published a Digest of select articles published up to 175 editions in 8 volumes.

India Book of Records has recognised PreSense for publishing a maximum number of digital-only eMagazine since 2006 through voluntary efforts.

The Foundation has conducted 14 editions and presented 125 Awards until 2024. IIT Madras was the supporting Partner up to the 9th Edition. The 10th Edition was held at Raj Bhavan, Tamil Nadu. The 11th, 12th, 13th, and 14th Editions were held in New Delhi.

India Book of Records (IBR) has recognised Sansad Ratna Awards for maximum number of Parliamentary Awards (86) given and maximum number of award events (12) by the civil society based on the performance in consecutive years.

Foundations of Vision (1999-2008): Igniting Change

#### **Visionary Programmes**

In a landmark moment, Videsh Sanchar Nigam Ltd (VSNL) introduced internet services to India on 15th August 1995, opening a new digital era for public access. Just four years later, Prime Point Foundation was born in December 1999.

Even before its inception, Srinivasan had already united communication professionals globally through platforms like prpoint and image management groups. With internet speeds of only 18 kbps—yes, 18 kbps—the Foundation launched initiatives to reveal the transformative power of this emerging technology.

Even before Yahoo launched its 'Yahoo Groups', Srinivasan had already begun in 1998, using onelist.com and egroups.com, which were later acquired by Yahoo. He connected global communication professionals through the 'Image Management' and 'prpoin' groups. To fulfil Dr. Abdul Kalam's vision, he also created the 'India Vision' group, uniting over 3,000 young people from across the country. These groups were subsequently absorbed into Yahoo Groups.



**June 2000:** Prime Point Foundation held its first workshop on "New Media Content and Communication" at Anna University, Chennai, geared toward working journalists and media students. Dr Kalanidhi, the University's vice-chancellor, inaugurated the event, setting the stage for an innovative program.

**July 2000:** The Foundation hosted Dr. M. Anantha Krishnan, a prominent academician, and Suresh Kamath, CMD of Laser Soft Info Systems Ltd. They delved into the anticipated IT revolution, inspiring attendees with insights into the future of technology in India.





Prof. Sreenath Sreenivasan, Associate Professor of Journalism in Columbia University addressed the journalists at Chennai on 30th July 2000 on Emerging trends in Journalism.

**August 2000:** In an engaging session, Prof. Sree Sreenivasan from Columbia University spoke on "Emerging Trends in Media and the Use of the Internet." Although the internet was still in its infancy, Prof. Sreenivasan predicted that it would redefine communication as we know it.




**December 2000:** T. S. Krishnamurthy, the Election Commissioner of India, delivered an insightful presentation on the importance of effective communication for politicians. The event drew a notable gathering of prominent political leaders, all keen to enhance their communication skills in public service.



**December 2001:** A dynamic panel discussion explored ways to enhance the public image of the police force. Esteemed panellists included V. R. Lakshmi Narayanan, former Director of the CBI; Ganapathy, then DGP; and J. K. Tripathy, Additional Commissioner of Police. Consumer advocacy groups and media representatives joined them, sparking a lively exchange on building trust and transparency within law enforcement.



**February 2002:** Senior officials of the Life Insurance Corporation of India attended a three-day workshop on "Communication and Brand Building." Held against the backdrop of the newly opened insurance sector, the workshop focused on strategies to enhance LIC's brand presence and competitive edge in a transforming industroa landscape.



March 2002: Leveraging its vast network of global communication professionals, the Foundation set out to launch an ambitious newsletter, *PRPOINT Newsletter*. Over eight issues, the newsletter featured thought-provoking interviews with global experts on cutting-edge topics—well ahead of the curve. From blogging, a concept then in its infancy, to other visionary subjects, *PRPOINT* aimed to ignite conversations about the future of media. However, with its focus solely on emerging trends rather than contemporary topics, the newsletter struggled to find a broad readership and concluded after eight editions. A testament to its foresight, the newsletter's topics were pioneering—even if a bit too ahead of their time.



**April 2002:** In the wake of the insurance sector's liberalisation, N. Rangachary, Chairman of the Insurance Regulatory Authority, delivered a compelling address on "Transparency in Insurance Communication" to both

government-owned and private insurance companies. Senior officials from across the industry attended, engaging in discussions on building trust openness as essential pillars in a newly competitive market.





June 2002: K. P. Geethakrishnan, who served as

Finance Secretary during India's economic liberalisation, delivered an insightful talk on "Economic and Expenditure Reforms." His address provided a seasoned perspective on the transformative fiscal strategies that shaped India's modern economy.





**March 2003:** A full-day workshop titled "Effective Communication for Careers" was conducted at Anna University, Chennai, equipping participants with essential skills for professional success.



**August 2003:** An essay competition on the theme "India's Vision for a Developed Nation" was organised, inviting thought-provoking submissions from college students. The entries were evaluated by a distinguished jury chaired by Dr. Y. S. Rajan, co-author of *India 2020* alongside Dr. Abdul Kalam. Dr. Rajan personally presented awards to the winning students, recognising their inspiring visions for the nation's future.

**September 2003:** A certificate course titled "Communication Strategies for Working Professionals" was launched at the Stenographers Guild in Chennai. T. Theethan, the Accountant General of Tamil Nadu, inaugurated the course, which aimed to enhance effective communication skills among professionals.

**November 2003:** His Holiness Shri Jayendra Saraswathi Swamigal, the Sankaracharya of Sri Kamakoti Peetam, inaugurated Prime Point Foundation's training initiatives. Prime Point Srinivasan is seen receiving the Swamigal's blessings during the auspicious occasion.



**December 2003:** The United Nations selected Prime Point Foundation as the Nodal Organisation for celebrating International Volunteer Day annually on 5th December. For this inaugural celebration in 2003, Prime Point Foundation organised events to raise awareness about the importance of volunteerism and inspire community engagement.



**June 2004:** The World Assembly of Youth, a wing of the United Nations, organised a 'Youth Dialogue' in Malaysia. Prime Point Foundation was invited to participate, where Prime Point Srinivasan addressed the delegates with an insightful session on "Media Relations."





Ramamoorthy, and Corporation Bank, along with other distinguished figures from leading organisations. The participants explored the critical role of effective internal communication in organisational success, emphasising strategies to enhance clarity and engagement across all levels.



**June 2005:** Sree Sreenivasan, Professor at Columbia University and a global expert on New Media, engaged with media professionals at the Chennai Press Club. He shared insights into the latest developments shaping the global media landscape, sparking a lively discussion on the evolving role of media in the digital age.



June 2005: Scope International, a subsidiary of Chartered Bank, conducted full-day Standard а "Team Building workshop and Leadership on Development" for its team leaders and project managers with the support of Prime Point Foundation. The interactive session was designed to foster collaboration and help participants uncover and refine their leadership potential, enhancing their ability to lead and inspire their teams.



August 2005: The Public Relations Council of India (PRCI) hosted a National Convention in Hyderabad, bringing together public relations and communication professionals from across the country. Prime Point Srinivasan delivered а presentation on Communication." This accolade marked GFPR's first-ever award for excellence in communication, acknowledging Prime Point Foundation's groundbreaking use of digital media. The award ceremony took place in Hyderabad.



**February 2008:** The masthead and layout were redesigned in the second-anniversary edition to offer a more visually appealing style. This special edition **PHOTHE** featured an exclusive interview with Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, complemented by his audio podcast, adding a dynamic touch to the content and further engaging the readers.



**February 2008:** The Second Anniversary Special Edition was launched at a distinguished event attended by eminent personalities. T. S. Krishnamurthy, former Chief Election Commissioner of India; N. Vittal, former Chief Vigilance Commissioner of India; Dr. U. Srinivasa Raghavan, former Chairman of the Indian Postal Board; and other leading experts from various organisations graced the occasion, adding their valuable insights to the celebration.



**April 2008:** Traditionally, media partnerships for major events are reserved for print and broadcast media. In a groundbreaking move, however, the Chartered Institute of Public Relations in London selected the *PreSense* eMagazine as its media partner for the 5th World Public Relations Conference and Festival, held in June 2006. The functioning of the Lok Sabha came under severe criticism, especially towards the end of the 14th Lok Sabha in 2009, because of the frequent disruptions and pandemonium in the Parliament. The then Speaker, Shri Somnath Chatterjee, in his valedictory address for the 14<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha, was expressly critical and registered his unhappiness over the frequent disruptions in the Parliament. The public, too, criticised the conduct of the Parliamentarians through social media. In mock Parliament sessions held in colleges and schools, students were ridiculed by throwing chairs and creating a pandemonium. In the meantime, elections for the 15<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha were announced.

Around this time, on the suggestion of former President of India Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, Prime Point Foundation and the eMagazine PreSense decided to highlight the positive aspects of Indian democracy by recognising its topperforming parliamentarians, who quietly discharged their constitutional duties with exemplary commitment and performance. Prime Point Foundation and the eMagazine PreSense instituted the Sansad Ratna Awards to recognise and honour these Parliamentarians.

The performance of MPs in the Lok Sabha is assessed on four parameters: (a) debates participated, (b) questions raised, (c) introduction of private members bills and (d) attendance. Generally, the top performing MPs in the Lok Sabha did well in their constituencies too.

In this regard, the Prime Point Foundation and PR-e-Sense, two non-governmental organizations, have been honouring the country's top performing MPs every year since 2010 by bestowing them with 'Sansad Ratna' awards. They analysed their performance

### The Only Award by the Civil Society, 'We the People of India'

'Sansad Ratna Award' is the only Award presented by citizens and Indian civil society to honour the performing Parliamentarians. Many eminent citizens, including retired bureaucrats, professionals, social workers, and academicians of Chennai, are associated with the Awards Committee. Hansraj Ahir (Chairman, National Commission for Backward Classes), Dr M Veerappa Moily (Former Chief Minister of Karnataka and former Union Minister) and Shri T S Krishnamurthy (Former Chief Election Commissioner of India) are the Patrons' of the Awards Committee.

An eminent Jury Committee of eminent political leaders and civil society representatives, chaired by Hansraj Ahir and Co-Chaired by Bhartruhari Mahtab MP and T S Krishnamurthy, select the 18th Lok Sabha awardees.

Sansad Ratna Awards are conferred on those who receive the awards in person at the award ceremony. There are three types of Awards for individuals and Committees:

- 1. Sansad Ratna Awards (annual)
- 2. Sansad Maha Ratna Awards (once in 5 years for consistent performance in the Lok Sabha)
- Sansad Utkrisht Maha Ratna Awards (once in 10 years for consistent performance in two Lok Sabhas)

Till the end of February 2024, 125 Awards have been presented in person in 14 Award events.
